The Opportunity

Land Stewardship Centre (LSC) and the Beaver Hills Biosphere (BHB) are seeking a qualified individual to support our outreach and engagement coordinator and the Green Acreages and BHB Rural Residential Stewardship coordinator. The successful candidate will gain a breadth of experience working with LSC and BHB staff and partners on various projects related to conservation, education, restoration and climate change resilience.

The ideal candidate will:

- Be enrolled in an environmental or natural resource program and/or have experience related to conservation, land management, climate change mitigation and environmental modelling.
- Be comfortable attending various events, being outdoors and in the field, engaging with community groups and landowners.
- Demonstrate strong facilitation skills and be able to clearly communicate goals and projects to a variety of audiences, including visitors, stakeholders and the public.
- Contribute to social media efforts for both LSC and BHB.
- Network in virtual and in-person settings.
- Be willing to travel and have a valid Class 5 Driver's License.
- Be able to lift to a weight of 50 lbs.

This is a full-time position (approximately 35 hours/week) for a four-month term beginning April 25, 2025. The wage is \$20/hour. Travel within Alberta may be required.
